

Geographic Facts



I want to introduce you to the most diverse and craziest country in the world:




After a flight halfway around the world and countless stopovers, you will reach the Australian continent. You are now in the southern hemisphere, between the pacific and Atlantic Ocean. While you are still on the plane you can get to know the continent from above. It is already clear to you that the name, the smallest continent in the world, does not do justice to the vastness of the Australian outback.



Large parts of the country consist of deserts and semi-deserts as well as dry bush savannas. Only in the north there are tropical rain forests.

Australia is divided into 6 states and 2 territories which are the following, Western Australia, Northern Territory, South Australia, Queensland, New South Wales, Australian Capital Territory, Victoria and Tasmania. With an area of 7,692,000 km², the Australian continent is 22 times the size of Germany. However, the population is only one third of Germany. Therefore, the Australian population density is only 3.25 people/square kilometer. Most of the people in Australia live on the coast, as life in the outback is very difficult. The capital of Australia, Canberra, is also relatively close to the coast.



The highest summit to climb is Mount Kosciuszko, with 2.228 m. You don't have to be a mountaineer to get up there, as the hike to the summit is not difficult.

In addition, there are only 2200 plant species in Australia, in cause of the dry climate.



The climate in Australia ranges from subtropical in the north to temperate in the south. The average temperature swings from 15 degrees in winter to 25 degrees in summer. The conditions in the outback, are very extreme. Here the temperature fluctuates between 40 degrees during the day and minus degrees in the night. Aside from the desert and rain forest, there are also mountainous regions in Australia.



Great Barrier Reef: Would you like to experience incredibly fascinating nature up close? Then visit the largest coral reef in the world. Over 400 species of coral, 1500 species of fish, as well as sharks, rays and dolphins live on an area the size of Germany. As a dive or by helicopter, I am sure exploring the reef will give you a lot of breathtaking stunning moments you won't forget.



Sights in Australia

Ayers Rock: A visit to this Australian landmark should not be missed on your vacation. Have you ever seen a 3 by 2 km red stone in the middle of a flat landscape, which is 348 m high? This huge dimension certainly caused the native inhabitants to make this mountain their sanctuary. For this reason, it is officially forbidden to climb this mountain. However, you can hike around the mountain and take great photos





Sydney Opera House: On a city tour in Sydney, you should definitely visit the Sydney Opera House. It is right on the harbor of the city: The architectural marvel is not only an unbelievable sight from the outside, it is also worth seeing from the inside. There are 1.1 million tiles on the roof of Jørn Utzon's building. The house has 5 theaters with a total of 5400 seats, a cinema, 60 changing rooms and much more. In addition, over 500 km of power cables were laid.

Bondi Beach: Bondi Beach is the best place for activities on and in the ocean. Whether surfing, walk on the beach or just swim, the 1.22 km long beach is perfect for vacationers. The beach is also a place where many festivals take place, in 2000 even the Olympic beach volleyball competitions were here.



Plants and Animals



The kangaroo



The most famous animal in Australia is the kangaroo. It can grow up to 1.8m and weigh 90 kg. There are a total of 65 species of kangaroos. The most fascinating for me is the grey giant kangaroo, which reaches a maximal speed of 50 km/h and jumps over 9 meters. That's fascinating, especially when you consider that it only measures a few centimeters when it was born

The koala is definitely Australia's cutest animal. Koalas sleep an average of 20 hours a day. The distribution in Australia is limited to the east of the country, as there are enough eucalyptus trees. The nocturnal koalas feed mainly on eucalyptus leaves.






The Aborigines

Australia was settled by a once African people 50,000 years ago. These are the Aborigines. Over the years they lived from hunting and gathering and built up a close spiritual relationship with the nature and their land, which is very visible in their religion and culture.



The aborigines are very concerned about the preservation of nature. A particularly sacred symbol is the island mountain Ayers Rock or in the language of the indigenous people, Uluru. The Aborigines have adorned the mountain with many drawings and pictures, each with a special meaning for their religion.



The Australian natives are also famous for a very special hunting weapon, the boomerang. They distinguished 11 different species, with only 5 percent coming back. These boomerangs that came back were mainly used to hunt birds in flocks. The original boomerangs were also much more massive, measuring 1.3 m in length and weighing 2 kg. But boomerangs were not only used for hunting, but also as a digging stick, a percussion weapon or a musical instrument. After James Cook brought the first boomerang from his discovery of Australia in 1770, the Australian hunting device quickly developed into a popular piece of sports equipment in Central Europe and today there are many boomerang clubs and even a World Championship.


The Didgeridoo

Another invention of the Aborigines is the didgeridoo. A musical instrument made of wood. The instrument, which is of great importance for the tradition of the Aborigines, is also heard more and more in modern music and it is played all over the world.

An important part of the aboriginal culture is the dream time and the dream paths. In the dream time the Aborigines see their creation. They believe that there are creatures who created all humans. These creatures then gave nature to the aborigines. therefore, there is the dream time in which they come back to their creation time. The dream paths are songs and stories that contain information about orientation in the outback, which are passed on from generation to generation.



Freetime Activities



Surfing

Wave surfing is very popular in Australia and almost a national sport. I am sure this is due to the many beautiful beaches with good waves. In addition, the weather is actually very mild all year round and you can always get into the water.



Whale Watching

Whether dolphin, humpback whale or orca, on the Australian coast you will have an extraordinary experience while watching the whales. Many coastal cities offer boat tours, where you can see and photograph the whales up close. Often you can even learn something about the animals from an expert while you watch them.



The best way to explore the particularly beautiful places in nature is to camp, as there is not a hotel everywhere. Whether in a caravan, a tent or in the car, when you camp, you have more opportunities to enjoy the starry sky or the sunrise.



The largest coral reef in the world and mild weather all year round, perfect conditions for diving and snorkelling. Whether sharks or nemo fish, there is something for everyone. If you take a look below the surface of the water, you will discover a unique world in which 4000 species of fish and over 500 species of coral are at home.

European settlement



16th century: Spaniards, Portuguese and Dutch are the first Europeans to discover Australia.



April 28, 1770: Captain James Cook arrives at the east coast of Australia and takes possession of the land for the British Crown.



January 26, 1788 to 1868: 162,000 British convicts were brought to Australia and founded colonies there. This is also where Sydney got its name, because one of the first ship's captain named the new settlement after the British Minister of the Interior (Lord Sydney).



1788: New South Wales was founded.

1829: Western Australia was founded.

1836: South Australia was founded.


1851: Victoria was founded.

1859: Queensland was founded.

From 1851 to the end of the 1860s there was a gold rush in Victoria, that brought countless people to Australia. As a result, Australia's population has tripled.



middle of the 19th century: The natives of Australia, the Aborigines, were treated like animals by the settlers. Aborigines were killed, raped and their land was taken away. In addition, many natives died from the illness that Europeans brought with them.



January 1, 1901: All British colonies united, to form the Australian Confederation. The first capital became Melbourne.



until 1920s: The acts of violence against Aborigines are increasing and there are now only 60,000 of the former 1 million Aborigines living in the country.

1949: Aborigines officially get an Australian citizenship.

1967 the people of Australia finally decided to abolish all laws that discriminate against the aborigines.



2007/2008 There are now over 600,000 aborigines again and the government officially apologizes to the indigenous people. and there is also a national "Sorry-Day", on which the terrible treatment of the aborigines is remembered.
